



## Catalog of *Linked Immunisation Action Network* Resources to Strengthen National Immunisation Programming

The **Linked Immunisation Action Network (Linked)** represents an integral component of Gavi's strategic approach to engaging with middle-income countries (MICs) with the goal of preventing backsliding in vaccine coverage and driving the sustainable introduction of key missing vaccines. Linked designs and employs participatory and action-oriented collaborative learning approaches that bring together country practitioners, technical experts, and immunisation partners to identify common immunisation program challenges and the transformative strategies that will lead to greater resilience, equity, and sustainability. This brief outlines key Linked-produced resources available for countries to draw upon to address barriers to sustainability, equity, and new vaccine introduction.

### Effective Management and Supportive Supervision of EPI Delivery

Countries seeking effective and practical ways to strengthen immunisation programs and improve HW performance with limited resources can learn from Sri Lanka's experience implementing effective management and supportive supervision practices.

Linked is an evolution of the Learning Network for Countries in Transition (LNCT), a collaborative learning network that operated between 2017–2021, supporting over 20 countries transitioning from Gavi support to full domestic financing of their national immunisation programs. LNCT engagements were organized around 8 country-identified priority areas: COVID-19, Engaging the Private Sector to Support Immunisation, Financing Immunisation Programs, Financing & Managing Immunisation Programs in Decentralized Health Systems, Immunisation & Universal Health Coverage, Managing the Gavi Transition, Vaccine Hesitancy & Demand, and Vaccine Procurement.
